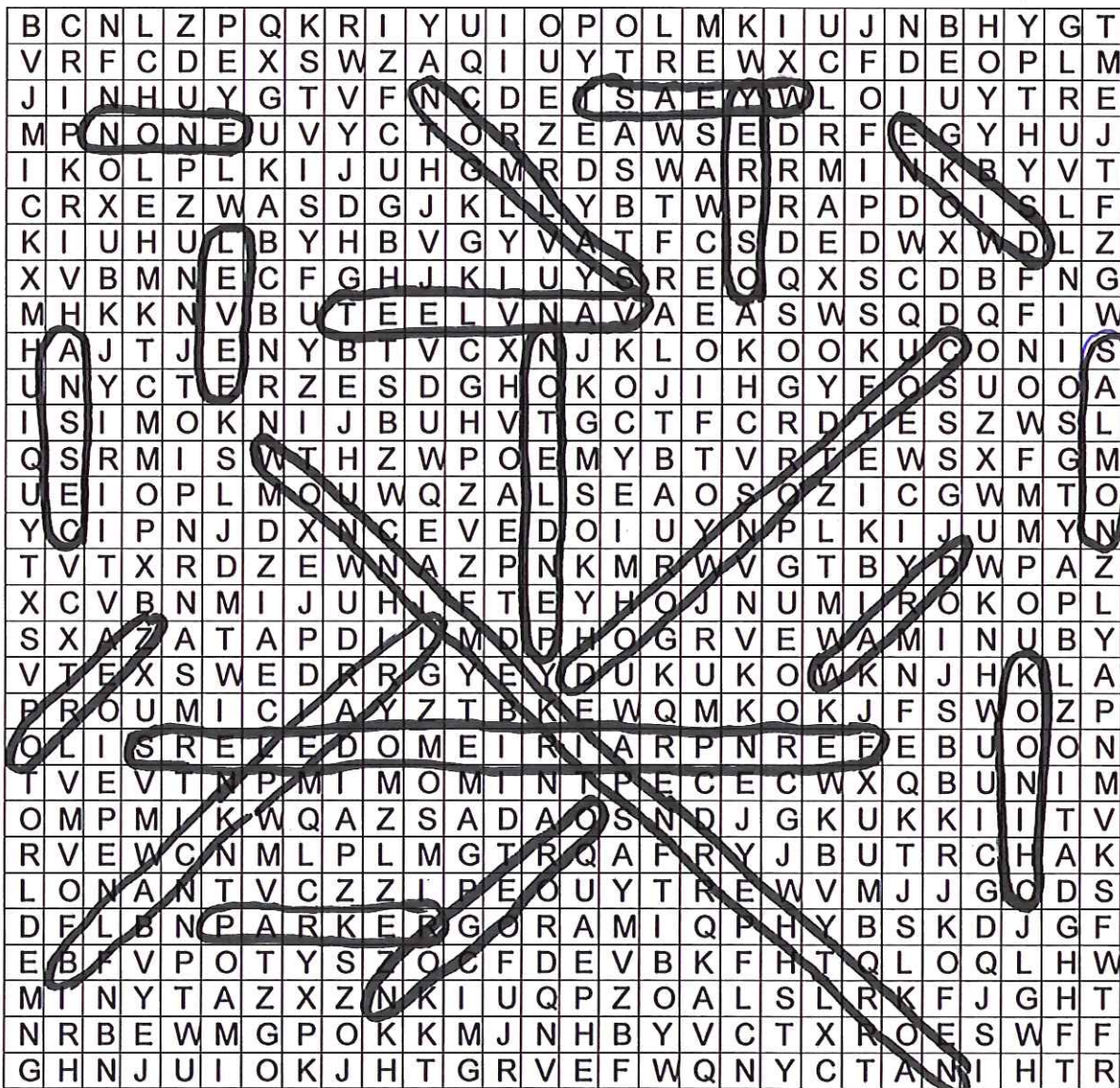

A. Acceptable answers: Van Vleet or Parker. (There is historical evidence to support both families.)

Q. The name of the plaza honoring a particular group of Indians who once made their home here.

**A. Chinook.**

**Q. Name of man-made structure completed in 1966 to prevent the Columbia River from flooding Washougal?**

A. Acceptable correct answers: Levee or Dike. (It's made up of rocks and dirt and about 5-miles in length.)

**Q. Number of visible smokestacks in the port industrial park.**

A. Acceptable correct answers: Zero or None. (Don't be fooled, there are no smokestacks spewing smoke into the air in the port industrial park.)

**Q. Largest mountain visible on the eastern horizon, named by the Multnomah Tribe?**

A. Wy'East. (We commonly refer to it Mt. Hood.)

**Q. Radio-controlled airplane club that uses a field near the industrial park to pilot aircraft?**

A. Fern Praire Modelers (Come out and watch their maneuvers some day and you will be amazed.)

**Q. What U.S. State is on the other side of the river from the Columbia River?**

A. Oregon (It's sometimes pronounced OR—EE—GONE by newcomers).

**Q. What is the name of the Beach at Captain William Clark Park?**
