



Invitation to Participate in the Port of Camas–Washougal Waterfront Park & Trail Project

Washougal WA – February 5, 2015 – The Port of Camas–Washougal invites the public to participate in and become a part of the design for the new Waterfront Park and Trail project that breaks ground within the next few months.

"Last fall, the Port invited volunteers to form several Waterfront Committees made up of local citizens with each committee focusing on a different amenity for this project, such as history, connectivity, signage or art," said Kim Noah, Port Finance Director and committee organizer. "The latest idea to come from this group is an opportunity to have one's family name or special message become part of the project design while also supporting future art along the trail."

The polished, gold tinted and 'blued' stainless steel plaque shaped and shaded to look like a native Salmon, and measuring 14.5" x 7.5" offers space for 50 characters of your choosing.



The cost to participate is \$250 per plaque, which offsets the cost and raises funds for future trail artwork. Each plaque will be embedded into the trail itself or as a feature on a wall along the trail.

"Steps are being taken to deter vandalism by ensuring placement is secure and permanent," added Noah. "We're pleased to offer a way for the public to become more involved. After all, this will be their park and their trail."

About the Port of Camas-Washougal

The port brings jobs and recreational opportunities through a 400-acre industrial park, a 79-hangar general aviation airport and 350-slip pleasure boat marina. Grove Field is a small, general aviation airport with a state-of-the-art fueling station and 14 tie-downs in addition to the hangars. The marina is the largest publicly owned marina on the Washington side of the Columbia River and has a floating restaurant, launch ramp, nearby hotel, fueling station, electricity on the breakwater/guest dock, and is homeport to the Dolphin Yacht Club. Recently acquired and in the planning stages, are 13.25 acres of Waterfront Property which connects to a 14-acre parcel of port-owned land to the east. The industrial park boasts a 90+ percent occupancy rate of more than 40 businesses with an annual payroll of \$8.9 million and is adjacent to Steigerwald Commerce Center, 120+ acres of property currently under development. The port also manages Captain William Clark Park at Cottonwood Beach, the adjacent protective levee and Parkersville National Historic site.
