Investing in the Airport

The Runway & Beacon Pole lighting project has been underway since September 12, 2016. Kitchen Electric, who is performing the work, has installed all of the conduit and set all of the base cans for the new runway lighting. Trench back-fill and wire install will be up next, along with Beacon Pole & Papi light installation. The Main radio control panel is in place and wiring is in progress. We anticipate completion to be early December 2016. If there are any pilots interested in volunteering to fly and assist with calibrating newly installed Papi lights please contact Jeramy Wilcox, Project Manager, at 360-949-3904 or Jeramy@portcw.com.

As for the C-Row & FBO Projects, we are waiting for the engineered drawing from the metal building manufacturer in order to submit them to the County for review. The county has informed us this process could take up to 3 months. To expedite the process the Port requested an early foundation permit from the County, which was denied. Another update will be



provided once drawings have been submitted to the County for approval. As as soon as we receive all the required permits and authorizations to procede, Tapani, Inc will begin construction. Stay Tuned!!!



Harbormaster's View

Cooler weather is here and the wind is starting to pick up. Just another friendly reminder to take all your summer toys home for the winter.

While many boaters have winterized their boats or put them into storage until spring, some of you still use your vessels for hunting or fishing, or just maybe cruising around. Unfortunately, the risk of an accident increases in cold weather so extra caution and preparation should be taken before heading out on the water in winter.

The importance of wearing a life jacket becomes even more critical when the danger for hypothermia is added to other concerns. Sudden immersion in cold water can have severe consequences, including cardiac arrest, quick loss of body heat, (the body loses heat 25 times faster in cold water than in cold air) and involuntary inhalation of water that may result in drowning. Wearing a life jacket can keep your head above water, keep you a bit warmer and provide a chance for rescue. It's simple... play it safe.

On November 29, 2016 the Port of Camas-Washougal plans to start the dredging project in the marina. If your boat is in the marina at this time, there is a good chance we will need to move it temporarily.
