Below is an excerpt from a small article I read in an on-line boating forum. I thought it appropriate as we head into the windy winter season.

Being able to securely moor your boat is one of the most important skills a boater can possess. Yet it's something that's frequently done very poorly, even by boaters with lots of experience. While it may not seem like a big deal there are plenty of instances where a bad mooring job causes major damage not only to the boat, but also other boats around it. No matter what kind of boat you have, knowing how to properly secure it can prevent a lot of expensive headaches.

Bow Lines: Bow lines stop the bow of the boat from moving side to side.

Spring Lines: Spring lines keep a boat from moving fore and aft. Generally only two of these lines are required; but sometimes more depending on the circumstances.

Stern Lines: Stern lines keep the stern of the boat from moving side to side.

With just a few more days of 2017 left, I wish all of you a Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year. Be safe, be happy, and hope for a mild winter and an early spring!
