HARBOR MASTER'S VIEW

Here we are winding down to the end of the season already. Before you know it winter will be on us. But for now, we still have a few good weeks of boating weather (I hope) so get in it before it's gone again!

I have noticed some tenants have a bit of trouble with their mooring lines. Please use enough line to properly secure your boat. Two spring lines, a bow line and a stern line at the minimum. With the change in seasons your mooring lines need to be checked or replaced. If you have any questions on mooring lines, come and see me. I'll be glad to help.

Page 3 Marina Policy Manual talks about "Quiet Enjoyment". It specifically states 4 things that are prohibited:

- Discharge of fireworks
- Any objectionable noise or odor given off by a boat or other equipment
- Creating a nuisance in any way, or unreasonably disturbing any other Marina Tenant or user
- Loud, boisterous, lewd or lascivious conduct

We've had a few complaints through the season, so let's keep it down to a low roar for the rest of the season.

Due to the forest fires in the gorge, we've had a lot of ash in the marina. Ash is an abrasive, so do not try to rub it off your boat. Thoroughly rinse your boat with water to avoid any scratching of gel coat or plexiglass.

DID YOU KNOW?

The carvings depicted on the "tayi", or headman stone in the Chinook Plaza at the Parker's Landing Historical Park, represent the Chinookan people of the past and future. The medallion depicts coyotes, humans, and Morning Star with her children. Morning Star was a Cascade Indian princess and the daughter of Cascade Chief Schluyhus (Slyhorse) and his wife, Running Fawn, who were part of the royal family. Basalt carvings were a tradition among the Chinookan peoples. The dedication and installation of the tayi is meant to be a testament to the survival of Chinookan people along the Columbia and Willamette Rivers.
